





As subjects of the Roman emperor, the Jews had to pay heavy taxes. A number of Jews were willing to supervise and collect these taxes. These tax collectors were despised and treated as social outcasts by most Jews. They were not allowed to hold any religious office or to give evidence in court. This was because most Jews believed that tax collectors were traitors and thieves, as the Romans allowed them to keep for themselves a proportion of any taxes they had collected. Jesus shocked many people by inviting a tax collector named Matthew to become an apostle.

The Old Testament prophets promised that one day God would send someone who would unite and lead the Jewish people. The title given to this anticipated figure was Messiah, from the Hebrew word moshiach meaning anointed one.


