





In A.D. 610 an event occurred that became known as the Night of Power and Excellence. <u>Muhammad</u> is said to have received a revelation from <u>Allah</u> (the Arabic word for God). The archangel Gabriel is said to have appeared and told Muhammad that he would be the Prophet of Allah, i.e. the one who would tell people the will of God. In A.D. 613 Muhammad received another <u>revelation</u>, after which he began publicly preaching in <u>Makkah</u>. He said that people should:

- · abandon polytheism
- · believe in Allah
- treat one another fairly

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· care for the sick and poor.

Muhammad angered Makkah's business and religious leaders by demanding that all idols should be removed from the Kaaba (which means the House of God). He said that the Kaaba should be used exclusively for the worship of Allah. However, these <u>idols</u> attracted many pilgrims to Makkah, and Muhammad was seen as a threat to the huge profits that were made from them by certain powerful people.

polytheism - belief in many different gods to preach - to give a religious speech to abandon – to leave a thing forever pilgrim – a person who makes a journey to a special place for religious reasons
